The Partnership for Warrenton Foundation recently named their new Interim Executive Director. Jennifer Heyns came on board at the end of July.

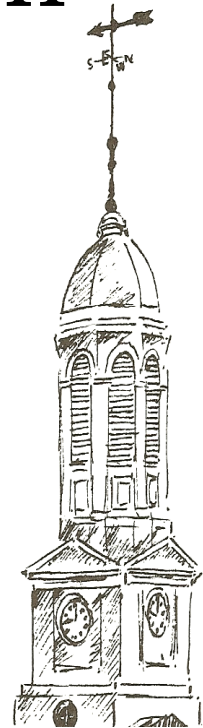
As a long-time freelance writer and reporter, Jennifer is a familiar face to many, but probably more familiar in name to most. Not for long, though,

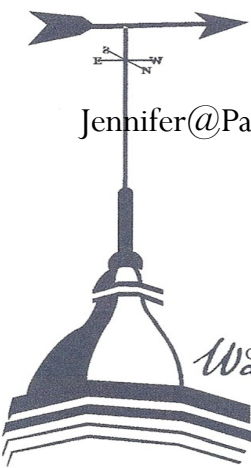
